#### PROGRAM: SEARCH AND RESCUE: HOW TO IMPROVE YOU SEARCHING AND ANALYSIS PRESENTED BY HANNAH ALLAN

You may know where to search for a genealogy record, but not how to search for it. This class will provide detailed tricks and methodology how-to's in order to find the information and records you are pursuing. We will cover how to effectively use online search engines and databases and how to analyze and draw clues out of the information you have.

Basically, we cover in depth how to analyze your information and then use the information to find more records and resources. It also covers how to effectively use online search engines and databases.

Hannah Z. Allan is the genealogist for the Oregon Historical Society and a private genealogist and consultant. She teaches and speaks at national and regional events and serves as the Vice Chair of Portland Metro Cemetery Advisory Committee. Hannah graduated from the BYU Family History and Genealogy program in 2011.

### Willamette Valley Genealogical Society's DNA Project

WVGS has a DNA Project for both men and women. To join under WVGS:

- 1. Go to the State Library URL at: http://oregon.gov/OSL/GRES/genealogy.shtml
- 2. Click on Genealogy Research on the left.
- 3. Click on WVGS DNA Project.
- Click on the Family Tree DNA icon in the middle of the page.
- 5. Scroll to the bottom of the next page and complete the form.
- 6. Click CONTINUE to complete the next screen.
- 7. Be sure to click only once when you are done so you order just one set.

You will receive a confirmation in your e-mail box that your order was taken. Remember: Only men can order the Y-DNA test, but both men and women can order the mtDNA. NEW! Discover close relatives and your ethnic percentages with Family Finder! Available to both males and females.

Family Finder uses autosomal DNA (inherited from both the mother and father, four grandparents, eight greatgrandparents, etc.) to provide you a breakdown of your ethnic percentages and connect you with relatives descended from any of your ancestral lines within approximately the last 5 generations.

#### **Ancestry.com News**

Two of WVGS collections are now indexed by the Ancestry World Archives Project (AWAP are volunteers who index databases). WVGS collections titled Marion County, Oregon, Census, 1895 and Marion County, Oregon, Marriage Records, **1849-1900** are finally available on Ancestry.com. They are indexed and now linked to searches. Our remaining database, Willamette, Oregon, Death Records, 1850-2006, is on Ancestry.com but not indexed so you can only browse it. It is also being indexed by AWAP, and projected to be ready in September of this year. The Oregon State Library's card file in the Alcove on the 2nd floor of the Library, titled Oregon, Biographical Index Card File, 1900-1986, is also available on Ancestry.com for browsing only. There are no plans for indexing this database.

#### **Oregon State Library Transformation**

I know that WVGS members must be tired of hearing the same thing about the Oregon State Library Transformation every month. There is no news to report. But each month I am contacted by someone from another historical or genealogical society that just heard about the issue. So I feel I need to keep the issue "out there".

On October 25, 2013 Senator Steiner Hayward and Representative Nathanson of the Joint Ways and Means Committee, Subcommittee on General Government, provided an outline for the transformation. Concerning historical, cultural, and genealogical materials that would not typically be used for research for state agencies the report says:

Oregon Genealogy: This function will fully shift to the Oregon Historical Society. OHS should then determine the best method of collaborating with outside genealogical groups, such as the Willamette Valley Genealogical Society.

State Documents and State History: All required state documents will be consolidated with the Archives and any materials that are not government records and should be kept for historical purposes will then be moved to the Oregon Historical Society

There really are two issues of concern to Oregonians. All taxpayers should be concerned about the cost of this proposal when moving is not necessary. It'll be expensive! The second issue is keeping the Oregon State Library's amazing collections open to the public for research.

# Oregon taxpayers are entitled to answers. Questions that you can ask Senator Steiner Hayward and your legislators:

- 1) What does it cost to maintain these collections at the Oregon State Library?
- 2) What will it cost to move the collections?
- 3) Where will the collections be housed and is there currently room at the Archives and Oregon Historical Society?
- 4) What plans do you have for an empty Library?
- 5) How will you guarantee free public access?
- 6) Why spend taxpayer money on moving collections when they have space now?
- 7) If you are insistent that the Oregon Historical Society be in charge of the collections, why can't they be left where they are under the supervision of OHS?

- 8) Why can't maintenance of these collections be funded by the General Fund instead of assessing other agencies? It's all taxpayer money.
- 9) If the object of the transformation is not to save the state money, shouldn't it be?

There is a Subcommitte work session on February 20, at which Sarah Miller from DAS will make a report. Information in the next newsletter.

The Oregon State Library has unique historical, cultural and genealogical collections. The public can go to the Library and use these materials, free of charge, with the assistance of the reference librarians and genealogy volunteers.

- 1) How accessible will the collections be when stored at the Archives?
- 2) Will the Oregon Historical Society charge to use the Library's materials?
- 3) What will be left at the Library when these collections are gone?
- 4) OSL has been providing free access to government and historical documents for 100 years. Why eliminate our library now?
- 5) The OSL reference librarians are a resource for state employees and Oregonians. See the Statesman Journal article on January 20, 2014 for information about these outstanding researchers.

You can continue to keep legislators aware by writing or emailing not only committee members but your legislator as well. Eventually a bill will have to go before the legislature. No one has told me yet that they have even received a response from the Subcommittee members.

You can also stay informed by liking the Facebook page "Save the Oregon State Library" and by spreading information to as many people as you can. The Facebook page is a good source of up to date information, questions and concerns.

## From EllisIsland.org PRESIDENTIAL ARRIVALS THROUGH THE PORT OF NEW YORK

Although millions of Americans can find their ancestors on the passenger manifests of the ships that arrived through the Port of New York and Ellis Island, many may be surprised to learn that prominent Americans traveled aboard those same ships, albeit not in steerage. These passengers included corporate barons, diplomats, actors, and prominent members of society, as well as U.S. Presidents

Upon arrival in New York City, the ships would dock at the Hudson or East River piers. It was there the first and second class passengers would disembark, pass through Customs at the piers and enter the United States. (The steerage or third class passengers were transported from the piers by ferry or barge to Ellis Island, where they would undergo a medical and legal inspection before being allowed to enter the country.)

Six of our U.S. Presidents are featured here, having entered the Port of New York either before rising to the highest office in the land or after leaving the White House.

**Theodore Roosevelt** — Twenty-Sixth President 1901-1909

- William H. Taft Twenty-Seventh President 1909-1913
- Woodrow Wilson Twenty-Eighth President 1913-1921
- **Herbert Hoover** *Thirty-First President* 1929-1933
- Franklin Roosevelt Thirty-Second President 1933-1945
- **Dwight D. Eisenhower** *Thirty-Fourth President 1953-1961*

#### Research

#### **DAR Library**

Did you know that you can search the DAR's library online for an ancestor? The Daughters of the American Revolution's **Genealogical Research Committee (GRC) database** is an index to more than 20,000 typescript volumes of genealogical data in the DAR Library in Washington, D.C.

- You may search "All States" or limit the search to a specific one in the drop down menu. Remember, however, that limiting the search in this way may result in information a relative living in another state submitted on your family being missed in the search.
- Surname: Surnames have been entered into the index as
  they appeared in the report being indexed. Be creative with
  surname spellings which you wish to search. You may
  wish to search with just the "Surname" field filled in to
  view all references to individuals in the index.
- First Name: First names have been entered into the index as they appeared in the report being indexed. Be creative with first name spellings which you wish to search.

ORDERING COPIES OF PAGES REFERRED TO IN THE INDEX

All copies must be ordered through the DAR Library's Search Service. Visitors to the DAR Library may make copies from the reports themselves. When ordering copies, please be sure to include the entire entry for which you want a copy. This would include the name in the index, the state, series number, volume number and page for the specific book in which that name appears. #### Wilsonville, Oregon Public Library

This index covers mostly Clackamas County and Oregon people and places, etc., including over 16,000 obituaries from over 100 years of Canby, Oregon newspapers, originally compiled by Canby Public Library volunteers and staff. The subjects of the obituaries were from a wide area including much of Clackamas County and northeast Marion County. Many otherwise unindexed sources in the Wilsonville Public Library Heritage Collection have also been indexed here by our volunteer (and former Library Director) Steve Turner. Presently about 20,000 entries in all, the index will grow over time. You can view an Adobe Acrobat file with information indexed to the sources below.
