This is needed for WVGS and Salem Public Library so we can have our collection housed there. This means we can proceed with preparing our collection for the move to Salem Public Library.

The agreement has been posted on the Beaver Briefs page so that members only can review it. You will need to use your password. Thanks to our webmaster, Dennis Hill, you can also see a map of where the WVGS area will be at Salem Public Library.

We can now go forward with preparing our collection for Salem Public Library. Our target date to be moved by is May 1st, 2015. Our books cannot be checked out of Salem Public Library but will be in the online catalog. We currently have members inserting magnetic security strips into the books. Member Deanne Smith is working on putting the books in Dewey Decimal order. As soon as these projects are completed, we'll be down to the last step—moving!

We will have Graebel Moving do the actual moving. In order to save money, members will have to put the books in the exact order on carts. When the carts are delivered to Salem Public Library, members will take them off the carts and put them in order on the shelves.

We still have a lot to do! Salem Public Library has some remodeling to do also.

Volunteers will have to go through the Library's volunteer training as well as WVGS training for genealogy. Volunteers will receive a parking pass after 20 hours of volunteering. And we still need a Volunteer Coordinator/Trainer!!

Members attending the March meeting visited our new office space. We are paying \$315 a month for rent, and also had to purchase liability insurance. Everyone was amazed at the organized space our members now have.

We have been able to do it with volunteer help and donated shelving. It started with Barb Hunter donating boxes and Jim Johnson, Kerry Wymatalek, John Cochran and Jerry Rodgers donating shelving. We have only had to purchase a lateral filing cabinet and rolling book cart (\$105 from Oregon State Surplus). Trina Brown donated chairs.

We have had a team who have transported boxes of books and organized the books and periodicals. It is not only for storage of our books and records, but a place to do books repair.

WVGS has always maintained our own library of books and this will also be a space where members can go to look through what we have. We hope to have it open at least one day a month.

None of this could have been accomplished without the hard work of a group of our members.

• Excerpts From The Woodburn Independent

Excerpts from this early newspaper, published weekly or twice weekly in Woodburn, OR (about 16 miles north of Salem), primarily those including area residents' names and area activities. This information can be useful in establishing that those mentioned were in the area at the time. (Much of the 1890 Federal Census is missing.)

Some volumes are missing information from periods that are not in the microfilmed newspaper records in the Woodburn City Library.
