What have you been doing during the pandemic? Member Dave Bruey has completed his book and published it! You can find "The Ancestry of Amelia Marilla Morley: The Morleys Reach Ohio" by David L Bruey on Amazon.com:

"The Ancestry of Amelia Marilla Morley presents her family history from the 1500s in England through the American colonial period and revolution to the deaths of her parents in the American Midwest in the 1880s. Mr. Bruey tells the family stories with a personal style attractive to both young and old readers. A remarkable depth of historical and genealogical research is apparent throughout the book. Antique woodcuts, maps, charts, old records, and other images illuminate the text. The Ancestry represents a new form of genealogical narrative that Mr. Bruey calls "storied family history." The women's as well as the men's lines are traced, and a story about each family or its times is told for every generation of every family line. As he states in the Introduction, genealogy makes history come alive, and history makes genealogy come alive. The narrative is followed by notes for genealogists. An extensive bibliography lists online and printed sources and offers advice on their use. A conventional ancestry report presents the genealogical facts. Indexes provide ready ways to search the pages for people and places. "

## President's Report for December 12, 2020

The General Meeting scheduled for December 12th was cancelled due to the continuing COVID-19 pandemic. Members were notified in the December newsletter that the meeting had been cancelled. The Executive Board did not meet on December 10th.2020.

1. Treasurer's report: Barbara Foster compiled a Treasurer's report for the month of November.

For November: Income for Operations was \$25 dues, \$14 for mailing Beaver Briefs, \$338.00 donations, \$50 for research, \$31.59 from Fred Meyer Rewards, \$2.77 interest for a total income for the month of \$461.36. Expenses for operations were \$50 for Oregon's Corporation fee, \$35.20 for mailing copies of Beaver Briefs, \$50 for printing Beaver Briefs, \$50 newsletter copy card, rent at Candalaria \$344.21, total \$529.41. We also renewed subscription to Fold3 for \$79.95 and newspapers.com for \$59.90 for a total expense in Research Resources of \$139.85. Total expenses were \$669.26. BALANCE on November 30, 2020 was \$33,217.19.

- 2. Membership Report from Sue Rempel: Membership has not changed: we have 1 Society, 20 Life members, 10 families/20 members, and 43 singles for 74 memberships or 84 members.
- 3. Meetings and speaker were cancelled.
- 4. Salem Public Library is closed. Volunteers will not be at the desk.
- 5. Corresponding Secretary Tony Hoff reported "Good news, requests are up again. We had 8 research requests in November, all to our society. There were a variety of requests covering many topics. We had requests for 12 obituaries, Ancestry Family Trees, who's buried in a grave, census, birth, burial and military records, newspaper articles, yearbook pictures and adoption information.
- 6. Craig Smith- working on the first issue of Beaver Briefs for 2021.
- 7. Dennis Hill has kept our website updated. He has added a link to SmileAmazon.
- 8. Old Business A virtual program would be lots of work for a few people who watch. We have not planned one yet. Officers for 2021 will be the current officers. No other nominations, so officers will continue as stated in the October newsletter.
- 9. New business The Salem Reporter, https://www.salemreporter.com/, contacted us for information for an article about WVGS. Tony Hoff did a great job responding.

  most important piece in progressing with your Italian genealogy quest: your ancestors' town of
  birth. Italian records are kept at the local level, so this elusive detail is necessary for locating
  ancestors prior to their immigration to the United States.
- Though your research will undoubtedly take you to many libraries, archives, and records repositories, the following resources will help you discover generations of Italian ancestors—all without having to leave your home.


