The good news is there are now 3 hours of free parking at the Library Parkade! Thank you to our volunteers for all coming back! We now have volunteers working Tuesday through Saturday, 11 am to 5 pm.

We are working on upgrading our website to have a secure website (https) so that we can have members pay dues for 2023 online through PayPal.

I also want to welcome new members Steve Holgate and family, Marilyn and Robert Dedrick of Silverton, Pamela Hutchinson of Sublimity, Sharon Ingram of Salem, and Rachel Alexander of Salem.

Craig Smith is working hard on ways to make materials such as genealogy books and city directories more accessible and searchable. Also FamilySearch scanned our old microfiche before the Library temporarily moved to Broadway. We have received a copy of the scanned microfiche. This has a variety of databases on it, including the Boston Transcript and the Holbrook Collection of Western Massachusetts records. Another task is to make this accessible to members.

Boston Transcript

Before the Internet came along, the primary vehicle for disseminating the comings and goings of any community was the newspaper. The Boston Transcript was a Boston, Massachusetts newspaper that regularly carried a page of genealogical questions and answers. That feature ran for several decades in the late 1800's/early 1900's. A Sample Entry:

(*184.) 1 White Benjamin White and wife Mary had a daughter Sarah, born March 18, 1700. She married, Sept. 17 1741. Isaiah (5) Thayer (Richard 1, 2, 3, 4) of Braintree Did Benjamin White hav Mayflower ancestry? I do not know where he lived and have no other dates. Page 4—February 2022
