

Document Research: Searches for Oregon documents can be done. If successful, the fee is \$10.00 per document or 3 for \$20.00 for nonmembers and \$5.00 per document or 3 for \$10.00 for WVGS members. If these require a trip to the Oregon State Archives, Marion County Clerk's Office or other sites, the fee is \$10.00 per document for members and non-members (3 for \$10/\$20 does not apply). The \$5 and \$10 charges include postage for 5 pages or less. If over 5 pages there will be a charge for postage and handling.

General Research

We will conduct searches using resources such as Ancestry.com, censuses, city directories, Oregon Donation Land Claims, newspapers, and other sources. General research is not restricted to research in Oregon only! The minimum fee for research is \$10, if successful. This includes a copy of one document. Research is \$10 per hour, \$5 for each additional 1/2 hour and the cost of additional documents. The \$5 and \$10 charges include postage for 5 pages or less. If over 5 pages there will be a charge for postage and handling. There is also a charge of 10 cents per page for every copy over 10 pages.

President's Report for September by Liz Tice, President


The August meeting was held at Salem Public Library in the Collaboration Space on the lower level. I want to welcome new members Susan Masse of Stayton and Michael Perez of Salem. We are temporarily having problems with our online membership form and online research request form so for now we should be contacted directly at willvgs@yahoo.com. The WVGS Board approved one more year of free membership for 2023.

Our speaker for August, Barbara Hunter, had to cancel so Doug Crosby was our presenter—showing how to use our new scanner for books and documents. We are planning on another program in October for members to try out the scanner. We have formed a "Scanning Committee" to work on scanning our publications.

Research requests have been slow—Juli Kennedy only received 2 requests in July. Beaver Briefs, Issue #3 was sent out by email and mail on August 19th. Many thanks to Craig Smith and Dennis Hill, as well as the contributors to the articles, WVGS members John Cochran and Tom Branigar.

Craig Smith is still working on downloading digital books for the volunteers to use. He also has suggested that we have a "Grand Re-Opening" in November as an open house. If you are interested in helping with that, please let me know at willvgs@yahoo.com.

We have not signed an agreement with City of Salem/Salem Public Library yet. We still have questions about liability and theft. Doug Crosby contacted an appraiser for our collection at the Library and the members at the August 13th meeting approved spending no more than \$5,000 on the necessary appraisal. 

- Salem Public Library now has a brand new electronic microfilm/microfiche reader/printer. It can do automatic frame by frame copying and store via flash drive, print or send results to an email address. Purchased by the Salem Library Foundation and set up in the Genealogy section the library.

Willamette Valley Genealogical Supports Keizer Community Library becoming A Public Library!

- Funding a public library is on the November ballot. Keizer voters will have the opportunity to vote to decide whether to fund a public library. Currently, the Keizer Community Library is a nonprofit supported by volunteers and donations.
- Keizer Community Library currently meets all qualifications to become a public library, except the requirement that half the library's budget must come from public funds. Passage of the November ballot measure would satisfy this requirement.
- The level of funding is yet to be determined by the city council.




Celtic Heritage??
