

Do you have old letters? 2 Documents? Perhaps a family scrapbook or diary? Photographs? Slides? Negatives? 2 This will be an opportunity to get your items digitized! If you have several items we will show  $\overset{\frown}{\sim}$ you how to use the equipment and let you proceed. We plan to have one of the work stations run by an experienced user, to scan a few items from any individual, in order to serve several 2 people more quickly.  $\overset{\wedge}{\sim}$ \$ The CZUR scanners accommodate items up to 13x19 inches, books or loose sheets. Multipage 2 materials can be saved as a single PDF file. **Document Research:** Searches for Oregon documents can be done. If successful, the fee is \$10.00 per document or 3 for \$20.00 for nonmembers and \$5.00 per document or 3 for \$10.00 for WVGS members. If these require a trip to the Oregon State Archives, Marion County Clerk's Office or other sites, the fee is \$10.00 per document for members and non-members (3 for \$10/\$20 does not apply). The \$5 and \$10 charges include postage for 5 pages or less. If over 5 pages there will be a charge for postage and handling.

#### **General Research**

We will conduct searches using resources such as Ancestry.com, censuses, city directories, Oregon Donation Land Claims, newspapers, and other sources. General research is not restricted to research in Oregon only! The minimum fee for research is \$10, if successful. This includes a copy of one document. Research is \$10 per hour, \$5 for each additional 1/2 hour and the cost of additional documents. The \$5 and \$10 charges include postage for 5 pages or less. If over 5 pages there will be a charge for postage and handling. There is also a charge of 10 cents per page for every copy over 10 pages.

#### President's Report for September by Liz Tice, President

The September meeting was held at Salem Public Library in the Collaboration Space on the lower level. I want to welcome new members Joni Roberts, Jenna Calk, Nenah Darville, Maria Cufflin, Georgie Ann Peck all of Salem, and BJ Towe of Keizer. The WVGS Board approved lending support to the Keizer Community Library becoming a Public Library.

Our presentation for September was by member Craig Smith, talking about the State Library of Oregon. Craig and his wife Deanne both retired from the State Library. Craig gave a great presentation on "User's Guide to Genealogical and Oregon History Research" at the State Library.

We have formed a "Scanning Committee" to work on scanning our publications. Research requests have been slow—Juli Kennedy only received 1 request in August. Craig Smith is still working on downloading digital books for the volunteers to use. He also has suggested that we have a "Grand Re-Opening" in January as an open house. Volunteers at Salem Public Library will receive training on the Microfilm Reader.

We have not signed an agreement with City of Salem/Salem Public Library yet. A book appraiser, John V. Henley of Portland, is working on an appraisal of our collection at the library.

We have had many discussion at Board meetings about how to attract members and keep them involved. One suggestion, which we are implementing, is to offer what we have most – knowledge. So if you live in the area, please come to the next meeting and "ask a genealogist".

Willamette Valley Genealogical Supports Keizer Community Library becoming A Public Library!

- Funding a public library is on the November ballot. Keizer voters will have the opportunity to vote to decide whether to fund a public library. Currently, the Keizer Community Library is a nonprofit supported by volunteers and donations.
- Keizer Community Library currently meets all qualifications to become a public library, except the requirement that half the library's budget must come from public funds. Passage of the November ballot measure would satisfy this requirement.
- The level of funding is yet to be determined by the city council.

Indigenous Peoples' Day



October 10, 2022

- Indigenous Peoples' Day is celebrated on the second Monday of October, on October 10 this year, to honor the cultures and histories of the Native American people. The day is centered around reflecting on their tribal roots and the tragic stories that hurt but strengthened their communities.
- In 1992, Columbus Day became Indigenous Peoples' Day.

### **5 FACTS ABOUT INDIGENOUS PEOPLES' DAY**

### 1. Female warriors

Native American women fought alongside men in battles, the most popular among them being the Buffalo Calf Road Woman of the Northern Cheyenne tribe.

### 2. Popcorn

The Indigenous Americans were the first to domesticate the strains of maize that produced popcorn thousands of years ago.

### 3. Maria Tallchief

The first Native American (and American) to dance at the Bolshoi Theatre in Moscow and with the Paris Opera Ballet was Maria Tallchief.


### 4.Hockey

The Native American tribes of Foxes, Saux, and Assiniboine played a game called shinny, which is where hockey came from.

### 5.The sequoia tree

The sequoia tree is named after the revered Cherokee leader Sequoyah, who created an alphabet for his people.

- Some people want to become enrolled members of a federally recognized tribe. Others want to verify a family tradition (belief, fact or fiction, passed from generation to generation) that they descended from an American Indian, either in their distant or near past. While others might want just to learn more about from whom and where they came.
- When establishing descent from an Indian tribe for membership and enrollment purposes, the individual must provide genealogical documentation. The documentation must prove that the individual lineally descends from an ancestor who was a member of the federally recognized tribe from which the individual claims descent.
- When people believe they may be of American Indian ancestry, they write or telephone the nearest Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) office for information. Many people think that the BIA retrieves genealogical information from a massive national Indian registry or comprehensive computer database. This is not true. The BIA does not conduct genealogical research for the public.
