Document Research: Searches for Oregon documents can be done. If successful, the fee is \$10.00 per document or 3 for \$20.00 for nonmembers and \$5.00 per document or 3 for \$10.00 for WVGS members. If these require a trip to the Oregon State Archives, Marion County Clerk's Office or other sites, the fee is \$10.00 per document for members and non-members (3 for \$10/\$20 does not apply). The \$5 and \$10 charges include postage for 5 pages or less. If over 5 pages there will be a charge for postage and han-

General Research

We will conduct searches using resources such as Ancestry.com, censuses, city directories, Oregon Donation Land Claims, newspapers, and other sources. General research is not restricted to research in Oregon only! The minimum fee for research is \$10, if successful. This includes a copy of one document. Research is \$10 per hour, \$5 for each additional 1/2 hour and the cost of additional documents. The \$5 and \$10 charges include postage for 5 pages or less. If over 5 pages there will be a charge for postage and handling. There is also a charge of 10 cents per page for every copy over 10 pages.

President's Report for November by Liz Tice, President

The November meeting was held at Salem Public Library in the Collaboration Space. I want to welcome new members Julie Wagner, Maryann Lundy, Bonnie Fullerton, Doug Crook, Maria Burgess, Cynthia Cuellar, and Jaydyn Burns, all of Salem; Rickie Hart of Keizer; Patricia Farrell of Newberg; and Anne Dorre of Kingman, Arizona. Treasurer Barbara Foster reported that the balance in our account is \$26,161.39. Income for October was from Fred Meyer Rewards, cash can donations, and interest. We had our usual expenses for rent and printing the newsletter.

For our program in November, Member Barbara Hunter gave a very interesting talk on "Mining for Genealogical Gold in California", especially emphasizing that even genealogists who have been working for long time should attend conferences as there is always something new to learn. We have some programs set for 2023 and at the meeting Kerry Wymatelek agreed to be 1st VP for Programs. He would appreciate help and/or suggestions for programs. Also our Scanning Advisory Committee is working to determine which publications need to be scanned. Juli Kennedy received five research requests.

We have not signed an agreement with City of Salem/Salem Public Library yet. We have had many discussion at Board meetings about how to attract members and keep them involved. One suggestion, which we are implementing, is to offer what we have most – knowledge. So if you live in the area, please come to the next meeting and "ask a genealogist".

Our society librarian Deanne Smith will start submitting 5 books to Salem Public Library each month to be added to our collection. All of our volunteer positions at Salem Public Library are now filled—new volunteers are Bonnie Fullerton and Janie Jenne.


