<u>Document Research:</u> Searches for Oregon documents can be done. If successful, the fee is \$10.00 per document or 3 for \$20.00 for nonmembers and \$5.00 per document or 3 for \$10.00 for WVGS members. If these require a trip to the Oregon State Archives, Marion County Clerk's Office or other sites, the fee is \$10.00 per document for members and non-members (3 for \$10/\$20 does not apply). The \$5 and \$10 charges include postage for 5 pages or less. If over 5 pages there will be a charge for postage and handling.

General Research

We will conduct searches using resources such as Ancestry.com, censuses, city directories, Oregon Donation Land Claims, newspapers, and other sources. General research is not restricted to research in Oregon only! The minimum fee for research is \$10, if successful. This includes a copy of one document. Research is \$10 per hour, \$5 for each additional 1/2 hour and the cost of additional documents. The \$5 and \$10 charges include postage for 5 pages or less. If over 5 pages there will be a charge for postage and handling. There is also a charge of 10 cents per page for every copy over 10 pages.



Historical Postcards

Ancestry.com has databases of postcards for the US and other countries. For members go to the card catalog, keyword "postcards". The site says: **About U.S., Historical Postcards, 1893-1960**

- This database contains over 115,000 historical postcards with photos of places in the United States. Each postcard caption has been indexed and may be searched by keyword or location. The database also includes the city, county, state, and postcard era (estimated year range) for most postcards.
- This database is primarily useful for obtaining a photograph or picture of a specific place in time. If you do not already have pictures of the places your ancestors lived, historical postcards are a good alternative to personal photos.



Related data collections

- United Kingdom & Ireland Historical Postcards, 1893-1963 This database contains over 19,000 historical postcards with photos of places in the United Kingdom and Ireland.

Update on Ellis Island

Ellis Island Records

- Castle Garden opened to immigrants in 1855 on the eve of a dramatic wave of European immigration. During the next 35 years, more than 8 million people passed through Castle Garden, especially from Germany and Ireland, and later from Italy and Eastern Europe. From 1855 to 1890, Castle Garden was America's first official immigration center.
- Ellis Island was open to arrivals to New York between 1892 and 1924. It now says it is "home to 65 million records of passengers arriving to the Port of New York from 1820 to 1957", including the Castle Garden records.

Actually Ancestry.com and FamilySearch also have the passenger lists also.

- Ancestry.com has indexed the New York Passenger Lists by ships arriving to New York from foreign ports from 1820 – 1957. Under "Immigration and Travel".
- Immigration Records on FamilySearch.org, free FamilySearch record collections: New York Passenger Lists (Castle Garden) 1820–1891:

This collection combines surviving passenger lists for those who arrived during the Castle Garden era with previous New York arrivals (back to 1820) and federal records kept before Ellis Island opened.

New York Passenger Arrival Lists (Ellis Island) 1892–1924:

Index of names and record images for immigrants who passed through Ellis Island from its beginning until 1924.

Louisiana, New Orleans Passenger Lists, 1820-1945

Passenger lists of arrivals in New Orleans, Louisiana. This collection corresponds to two NARA publications: M259: Passenger Lists of Vessels Arriving at New Orleans, Louisiana, 1820-1902 and T905: Passenger Lists of Vessels Arriving at New Orleans, Louisiana, 1903-1945. Some arrival dates are not represented in the data. Check the wiki or browse the collection to determine coverage. At present, this collection does not include NARA roll 142 from T905 containing arrivals for 1 Oct 1931 to 31 Dec 1931.




Immigrant Names

Ancestry.com hints on searching for you immigrant ancestor on a passenger list:


- Name Games. Officials at Ellis Island weren't in the business of changing immigrants' names, but more than a few new Americans adopted an Americanized name upon arrival or shortly thereafter. Search the Web for ethnic equivalents of a first name. Also look online for variations of surnames. Still can't find the right surname? Consider literal translations, too: the name Black, for example, may have once been its German equivalent, Schwartz. Or try lengthening and shortening names: Wise may have once been Weisen and before that Weisenberg and earlier still Weisenberger.
- **Search Secrets**. To get past handwriting and spelling variations, try a wildcard search in which you use asterisks to replace some of the letters in a name. For example, if the surname was Berlengauem, B*rl*g*m* would produce it as well as Burlingame and a handful of other variants. Or forego the surname and search using birthplace, age, gender, occupation and other details to find people who match the characteristics of your ancestor. Also try maiden names female ancestors may have traveled using them, even when married.
- Brothers, Sisters, Aunts, Uncles, Mothers, Fathers and More. Relatives and neighbors may have traveled with your ancestor search for them when you can't locate the person you're really hoping to find. Even if the family didn't travel together (check multiple pages of the passenger list just to be sure), you may discover other clues, like the name of a relative back home or a final destination, either of which could help you link family lines or clue you into chain migration or groups of strangers recruited to come to America for jobs. And don't let a father's passenger list record fool you: it wasn't uncommon for one member of the family, usually the family's head, to come to America and send for the rest of the family after settling in.
- **Oh, Canada.** For years it was cheaper for immigrants to travel from Europe to Canada and then cross the border into America. If your ancestor seems to be missing from the port you'd expect to find him or her, expand your search to all ports of entry as well as border crossings into America.

Always check the original, if possible. Frank Carmenita was Francesco Carminita but indexed as Francesco Caminita—makes a big difference when searching.
